The children are enjoying writing their own version of "Little Red Riding Hood" and have explored forests (we set up one indoors due to the bad weather) and wolves. The children might like to find out more on-line or looking at books etc.

Next week we are going to start growing our bean seeds. We will start them off in bags on the windowsill to observe how they grow – look out for them! We will also begin our new maths topic – multiplication. This will be very practical putting objects into groups of the same size (2s, 5s or 10s) and then counting them. Quite a few children could do with practising counting in 5s. If your child can count in 2s, 5s and 10s then you could try 3s. Many thanks.
