

Just to let you know this is what Ofsted are recommending for all schools across the board.



#### Laying the foundations at key stage 1-2

The foundation for this learning should be introduced from KS1 to include, for example, learning about:

- · Asking, giving and not giving permission (consent)
- · What makes a good friend
- · Boundaries and privacy
- · Challenging stereotypes and discrimination
- · About body parts that are private
- · About appropriate and inappropriate touch
