Looking forward

First, I know many of you will be wondering what is happening about our new building. I am pleased to say that work continues, as planned, for the new building and the feasibility study has been completed. Now the DfE are going through the rigorous process of selecting the company who will be given the job of building the new school. During the next phase of the process, more detailed drawings of the new school will be produced which I hope to be able to share with you as soon as they become available. In the meantime, an agreement is in place with Central Hall to accommodate us until the new building is ready.

We plan on introducing a few changes next year that we hope will make our school even more open and welcoming for parents/carers.

We will reintroduce Coffee Afternoons on Tuesdays at 14.00, which will be open to any parents/carers who would like to join us. These are a great place to meet others, find out more about what is happening in school and meet a range of school staff including myself and the Chaplain. There are also plans to continue providing Bake Club, Creative English Classes and Kintsugi Hope Groups for parents/carers.

Following feedback, parents and carers will be invited to wait in the playground at pick-up time so that the experience is more comfortable particularly for those of you with younger children.

We will also introduce half-termly open mornings for parents to come into class and see what and how children are learning.



Although we will still have a staggered end time for different classes, we will try to ensure
