## Summary of Achievement of Pupil Premium Children 2017/18

- Disadvantaged pupils made accelerated progress. On average they made 4.9 steps of progress which is equivalent to 2 terms extra progress over the year.
- 64 % of PP pupils achieved GLD which is 8% higher than PP pupils nationally.
- The GLD attainment gap is 6% which is smaller than the national gap of 17%.
